Accomplished or Skilled, What does that mean?

To be able to have your evaluation cycle on a 1 or 2 year rotation, you MUST have SGM (by law).

Example 1: Value Added teacher with no SLO, therefore no Student Growth Measure (SGM) because VA data can't be used since wor we are under Safe Harbor, still has a full app evaluation cycle next year, regardless if they fall. were rated accomplished or skilled.

Example 2: Value Added teacher has a SLO this year because they knew their VA data wasn't able to be used and ended up being rated accomplished or skilled. They can go into the 1 year rotation (skilled) or 2 year rotation (accomplished) BUT during their "off" years they still have one observation and post conference and an SLO or VA data once we are out of Safe Harbor, because in each of the "off" years the SGM has to remain at or above otherwise the teacher goes back into the regular evaluation cycle.

Example 3: A teacher who is up for contract renewal has to go through the entire evaluation cycle regardless of their rating.
